BACKLINE

- 2 SENHEISSER 441 microphones (one for sax and one for Ariel voice + microphone stand)
- 1 acoustic piano (grand or half-grand) to confirm model and tuning before the concert + adjustable stool + appropriate microphone
- 2 microphones for guitar sm57 or sennheiser 906 uno for voice+ micro pie, guitar amplifier type: Fender de luxe reverb/Koch Studio Tone/Vox Ac30 or similar
- 1 jazz double bass with movable bridge (on request) + 400 W double bass amplifier (1x14 or 4x10)
- Jazz Drums: Drum brands Gretsch (USA), Canopus, Yamaha (Maple Custom, Recording)
 - 18" or 20" bass drum, 12" aerial tom, 14" base tom with rough white patches or Fiberskyn type.
 - 14" box, mid/high tuning, with rough white head.
 - Saddle, without backrest, preferably bicycle type.
 - Classic boom pedal, felt mace. Carpet
 - HiHat foot, 2 snare feet, 3 giraffe cymbal feet
- 5 stage monitors, 5 independent monitor lines
- Dressing rooms with mirror, towels and iron (if possible)
- Small table on stage to support the second saxophone, two high stools for guitar and contra
- Water on stage and dressing rooms and catering to be confirmed
